HOW OFTEN SHOULD I CHANGE MY FILTER?

The recommended change schedule for your filter pack is every four to six months under normal air quality conditions. Changing your filter more frequently makes your system run more efficiently. Certain conditions in your home will significantly add particles to the air. This will cause the filter to capture more particles than usual, shortening the effectiveness of the filter to less than four months. Running your air purifier continuously could shorten the effectiveness of the filter. If you use your air purifier near smoke, wood burning fireplaces, pets and construction work, you will likely have to change your filter more frequently.

INSTALLATION

- 1. Power off the air purifier.
- 2. Remove the front cover and washable pre-filter



Replace the used filter with a new 2-in-1 Activated Carbon Filter and HEPA filter. Re-attach the pre-filter and replace front cover.



- Plug in and turn on unit. Touch and hold the Sleep icon for 5 seconds to reset the Air Quality Filter indicator. The Check Filter indicator will turn off, the Home icon will illuminate and normal operation will resume.
- Dispose of the used 2-in-1 Activated Carbon Filter and HEPA filter. Do not reuse or wash.
